Report on Price Increase and Pre-Increase Stock.

On Page One of the previous Issue of the Exakta News we printed an article: Price Increase on German Equipment Averages 30%. For our many new readers we are re-printing this article on Page Three of this issue.

Again we have bad news and good news for you. The bad news first: Quite a few of the items offered in the previous issue at preincrease prices were quickly grabbed and are sold out. You will not find them in this issue. That's the way the cookie crumbles.

But there is good news, too: We still have quite a few items which we can (and do!) sell at the old prices. I would have been a poor businessman if I had not stocked up at pre-increase prices. The result: you can still buy many lenses and accessories at prices that will soon be nothing but fond memories like the penny postcard!

Let me repeat what I said previously: Read this Issue of the Exakta News carefully! Take advantage of the old prices. Sooner or later our current stocks will run out. Please send your order as soon as possible. It's money in your pocket.

Genuine ...

You may have noticed that we have, of late, made frequent use of the word "genuine", describing lenses and accessories. Sometimes we use the word, sometimes we don't. Everybody knows, of course, that we sell only genuine Jena lenses, or genuine Schneider lenses, or genuine Ihagee PentaPrisms. Why then do we use the word more and more frequently?

Because there are many not-so-genuine articles floating around, waiting to be sold to the unsuspecting public. There is, for example, a lens which looks very much like a genuine Jena Pancolar and which is actually offered as a Pancolar but which has never seen the fair city of Jena. If you have a Pancolar and suspect it to have crossed the Pacific on its way to the USA (rather than the Atlantic) try to unscrew the front ring which bears the name "Pancolar" (but NOT the word "Jena") and you will find another name underneath, neatly covered by the innocent-looking new name ring.

There is another lens, billed as "Schneider F1.9." Perhaps you have bought one of them at a "bargain" price. What you received was a lens in plastic (!) mount, no more like the genuine Schneider Xenon than Hamlet to Hercules. Not that this lens is being offered as a Xenon. If you interpreted the description to mean Xenon, well . . . It's just not a genuine Xenon, that's all.

The list of these not-so-genuine items is as long as the list of Don Juan's conquests. Next time somebody offers you what looks like a big bargain, take a second look. A hard look. Caveat Emptor!



New Exakta VX-500 catches on fast.



I can't recall an Exakta Model which equalled the acceptance of the new Exakta VX-500. One rather brief announcement in our last Exakta News and we were swamped with orders. Apparently, the Exakta VX-500 is just what everybody (or nearly everybody) wants. A full size Exakta which takes all the lenses and accessories of all the other Exakta Models but which comes without the more expensive frills of the Exakta VX-1000TL (such as the 1/1000 sec., the very slow speeds and the delayed action speeds). Many customers equipped their Exakta VX-500 with the BTL System and the F2.8 Automatic Domiplan and had a Through-the-Lens Metering Camera at a hard-to-believe low price. Many customers bought an extra body as a spare or for black-and-white film. And quite a few VX-500 Exaktas were bought for younger family members of older Exakta Owners. (As usual, "younger family members" includes wives, too).

The light from the gold toned flash tube has sunny daylight quality; it produces beautiful, natural skin tones as well as more pleasing overall color quality.

POLARIZER

Did you know that there are very few exceptions to the rule that EVERY picture should be shot through a Polarizer? Without a Polarizer, glare obscures color. Roofs, roads, cars, leaves look whitish grey in direct sunlight because they reflect the bright sunlight as glare. A Polarizer cuts through the glare and brings out the true colors which are normally hidden under the glare. Flowers look more natural. Leaves look green. A Polarizer also kills the glare that makes it difficult to photograph through glass (car or train windows, showcases, museum display cases, framed-under-glass pictures). The Polarizer will make the glass "disappear". And, most important, a Polarizer makes the sky take on a deeper blue and clouds show up fleecy white.

And if you can convince a few of your friends that they should buy an Exakta and nothing but an Exakta, don't forget to tell them that Seymour's specializes in the Exakta and nothing but the Exakta.

Pre-set Lenses, anyone?

Let us take a good hard look at preset lenses! Ever since the first automatic lens appeared on the market, the popularity of preset lenses has waned, and as the years go by, fewer and fewer preset lenses are being bought.

It seems to me that many Exakta Owners overlook the usefulness of preset lenses. True, the extra money you spend on an automatic lens buys a certain amount of convenience. But nothing else.

Sometimes a customer tells me that he'd rather wait till he can afford an automatic lens, even though he could use the lens right away. I never contradict these people. They know what they want. Or do they?

If I needed a lens of a certain focal length, I would buy it. Automatic, if I could afford it. Preset, if I had to watch my budget. And if I had my choice of two different focal lengths in preset lenses or a single lens in automatic mount, I would not hesitate and decide on the two lenses.

I don't want to talk anybody out of buying automatic lenses. Automatic lenses are my bread-and-butter and we could not pay our rent if our customers stopped buying automatic lenses. I certainly don't want to belittle their great advantages. I just don't want you to overlook the preset lenses. Think of all the pictures you could have taken with the low-priced preset lens while you were waiting for that fancy automatic lens!

With a preset lens you set the diaphragm pre-selector on your chosen F stop, exactly as you would set it on an automatic lens. The only difference is that YOU furnish the "power" needed to close the lens down to the correct aperture while an automatic lens does it by means of built-in springs.

There are still customers who are a bit hazy about the term "preset." Some people even think that it refers to a fixed aperture, pre-set at the factory, an aperture which cannot be varied. Let me explain, in a few words:

A preset lens has two rings. One usually has a red dot which you set opposite the F stop you want to use. The lens is still wide open for brilliant viewing and focusing. A fraction of a second before you trip the shutter you flip the second ring (which is the actual diaphragm activating ring) till it hits the built-in stop. It has stopped precisely at the F/Stop which you had pre-selected. After you take the picture, you flip the ring in the opposite direction and your lens is again wide open for composing your next shot. Now, that isn't so different from an automatic lens, is it? The preset lens has exactly the same built-in memory as the automatic lens, even though it does not do the "flipping" for you. And the lack of the automatic feature does not make the optics any worse. That's obvious.

Extreme Wide Angle

There is no limit (well, almost no limit) how wide you can make the angular coverage of a lens. But there is a limit how wide you can make the angle without distortion! The limit is 80 degrees. No amount of fancy talk can make this simple optical fact go away. If you want a lens which makes a beer barrel out of a building, go right ahead and buy a wider lens. My advice: Make 25mm your limit. A 25mm lens is the very limit at which vertical lines remain straight.



Slide Punch ("Notcher")



Why do slides have to be "notched?"

When we introduced the new Slide Punch, we thought everybody knew what it was for. Not so. While nobody actually asked for a recipe for the punch, we did get get many letters asking how and why.

WHY: Cardboard mounted slides have four identical edges and two identical sides. Did you know that there are eight (yes, eight!) ways to put a slide into a projector, a magazine, or a viewer? Obviously, only one of the 8 positions is correct. Slides can be upside down, on their sides, reversed (so that COCA COLA signs read ALOC ACOC in mirror writing) or reversed AND upside down, or reversed AND on their sides, etc.

There is only one way to prevent this embarrassing interruption of slide shows: Punch a notch into the cardboard which tells you visually (when it's light) and by touch (when it's dark) which way the slide "goes." When you place the slides into a magazine, the lined-up notches immediately signal any slide whose notch does not line up with the rest of them. The punch gadget is designed to put all the notches in exactly the same spot on all slides.

HOW: You drop the slide into the punch and press. Your slide comes out with a visible and "feelable" notch.


Once your slides are notched, it is impossible to insert them in any of the seven wrong ways. Without guesswork, without time-consuming trial-and-error, all your slides are quickly lined up correctly. No more "Oops! Sorry!" when you project your slides, no more embarrassment, no more mood-killing interruptions.

New Model Travemat Through-the-Lens BTL Light Meter Prism System

When the first model Travemat was announced it was something of a mystery to many Exakta Owners. By now, just about everybody knows that it measures the light AFTER it has passed through the lens and that it sees exactly the same amount of light as the film. However, there are quite a few things about this system that many Exakta users have not quite realized.

Let's take regular scenic photography first. The Travemat has two independent sensors. It measures the light just below the horizontal center line and slightly to the right and left of the vertical center line. The result is an intelligent reading of the light intensity, totally eliminating the glare from the sky. Experienced photographers point a hand-held meter downward for exactly the same reason. You "point" the Travemat exactly at the scene you want to photograph and its "brain" does the "thinking" for you. The Travemat is a true Point-and-Shoot Meter.

Where the Travemat really shines is in all types of photography where you ordinarily would have to use Exposure Compensation. Say, you shoot with a Polarizer on the lens. By what factor do you have to increase the exposure? Forget it! The light that goes through the lens has already passed through the Polarizer and the Travemat "sees" only the usable light just as the film does. It does not care why there is less light. It measures what it sees. You don't care either: You completely IGNORE all compensating factors. You shoot as if you had never heard of a filter factor. The Travemat has done all the "compensating" for you. That goes for any filter factor. With the Travemat you just ignore it.

Here's something else: Has it ever occurred to you that not all your lenses may be calibrated correctly? How can you know whether your lens is really F5.6 when you set it at F/5.6? Anyway, F/5.6 is not an absolute figure as far as light transmission is concerned. It is merely a mathematical ratio of the diameter to the equivalent focal length. Certain standards have been adopted to make F stops less arbitrary but the fact remains that you cannot check the accuracy of the F stop settings on your lens. The Travemat (and you) couldn't care less. The Travemat does not see the markings on your lens. It sees the light that passes through your lens. While the two values might vary considerably, the only true value is the one the meter sees! All of a sudden, your exposures are correct. You may surprise yourself by getting perfect shots from lenses that used to give you blueish pictures before you used the Travemat.

Of course, the Travemat is totally indispensable in Macro Work. Remember what you had to go through, to compute your exposure? Extension, magnification, filter factors and on and on. You had to be an expert evaluator of the various influencing factors and you had to be able to translate all these factors into exposure speed and F stop adjustments. And you had to be a mathematician. Now you let the Travemat do it all for you. Concentrate on taking your Macro Photographs instead of wasting most of your time figuring and calculating and wondering where you made your mistake. The Travemat takes ALL variables into consideration. Your exposures will be correct.

Operation of the Travemat is simplicity itself: After you set the ASA rating of the film and the shutter speed, you watch the indicator needle (which you see in the viewfinder) as you vary the lens opening. As soon as the needle shows between the brackets, you shoot.

No matter what kind of shots you take, the Travemat will make picture taking easier and foolproof, even under the most difficult conditions. What's more, every single one of your shots will be perfect.



Micro-Grid vs. Split Image

Hardly a day goes by that does not bring several letters from customers telling me that they are confused about the various focusing screens. The question most often asked is: Mr. Seymour, why do you recommend the Micro-Grid, and why do you prefer it to the split-image gadget?

Let me begin by explaining the two methods of focusing. The old fashioned split image rangefinder has two small wedges in the center of the screen. The eye, looking for the sharp image, will find the image either above or below the focal plane. In either case, the wedges will displace the image. As you focus the lens, the image will eventually move into the correct plane and there will be no more displacement. The "broken" line becomes continuous. Theoretically, this works fine. But unless you relax your eye completely, you will psychologically move the image into the plane where the image becomes "unbroken." You think you are in focus but you are not. You have to learn to use the split image or you will not get it to work. Even though the image "moves," the split-image has no moving parts and the "moving" is done by the nerves controlling your own vision.

Now don't get me wrong. Thousands of Exakta users swear by the old split-image gadget and we still sell a large number of these screens. If you know how to use it, we have it in stock and we won't fight you if you order one. The "Micro-Grid" is a new optical development. Its main advantage: sharp focus is achieved regardless of the user's eyesight. The Micro-Grid superimposes a grid pattern over the image when the lens is out of focus. Once in focus, the grid disappears and the image appears crystal clear. Unlike the split-image, the Micro-Grid does not black out. With the Micro-Grid there is no guesswork: you are either in focus, or out. The Micro-Grid is now available in a combination screen: A light-gathering Fresnel Screen produces a brightly illuminated viewing image (bright from corner to corner). The Micro-Grid is in the very center and around it is a ring of ultra-fine groundglass for a quick visual check of the focus (for the doubting Thomases who don't trust any rangefinder and must be re-assured by a back-up device).

Yes, you still have your choice but I do recommend the Micro-Grid. It is easier to use than the old split-image glass and it is more accurate. I personally also find it faster to use, but I won't argue this point.

How long is long?

Professional photographers know it but most amateurs are totally unaware that a lens of moderately long focal length gives the most pleasing results for "people" shots. In fact, no professional would give up his medium length "telephoto" lens for all the rice in China. Strangely, most amateurs have not yet discovered this type of lens. Mention "Telephoto" and they'll immediately think of a 135mm lens. A 135mm lens is fine and it's probably the most logical choice for the first telephoto lens you buy. But think about it: could it be that for many shots a 135mm lens is too long? Did it ever occur to you that a 135mm lens, in one fell swoop, jumps from the full area your 50mm lens gives you to an area less than one-seventh in size? Sounds incredible, right? If you don't believe it, square the focal lengths and divide. See? I told you!

Obviously, this is too big a jump. You need something to bridge the gap. Something that gives you one third, or perhaps one quarter the area. Using your newly learned formula, you quickly figure out that a 90mm lens gives you about a third, while a 100mm lens gives you exactly one quarter the area. You need this "in-between" focal lengths for all shots for which the 50mm lens is too short and the 135mm too long. Perhaps you don't quite see it by just reading about it; but once you have used your "medium" lens, you'll use it for more shots than either your normal lens or your 135mm lens. Once you have used it, you wonder why nobody ever told you about it. Why? Because most people don't even know that such lenses exist!

It is true that there aren't too many lenses in this focal range (which runs from 85mm to 105mm); but some of the very best lenses are in this category. The reason may be that the market for these lenses is made up of a very high percentage of professionals.
